# **Attendance**

**Regular attendance at school is significant to a child's educational development and progress.** When a child's attendance falls to 90% or below it is classed as persistent absence. We hope that by working together, attendance will improve and children will achieve fully in school. The school's policy for attendance is available on the school website. We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96%.

Our Reception class had the highest attendance for the third week in a row with 98.6%. Other classes attendance was follows: Y5 - 96.7%, Y2 - 95.4%, ,Y6 - 92.7%, Y4 - 92.6%, Y1 - 91.7%, N - 90.4%, Y3 - 87.3%.

The classes in green are above our target of **96%** and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance.

Parents can notify school of their child's absence through the School Spider App. You will need to log into School Spider to do this, if you need help logging in, please let school know.

If you are unable to call school, e.g no credit on your phone, please use School Spider.

### Be in to win!

Thank you to all families who supported the 'Be in to Win' event for November. Last November we had 82 children in for the whole month. This November we had 147! A staggering improvement, so well done everyone! It was so successful we are trying again this month – the children are really keen to earn themselves a selection box on the last day of term.

Same rules apply: **Every child** who is **in school** for the **whole of December** will receive a **selection box on the last day of term – 22<sup>nd</sup> December.** They **MUST** be in school every day for both morning and afternoon sessions to win the advent calendar – not off with a valid reason, but in every day. We will see if we can get as many children as possible to attend school every day this month. If your child has an appointment they must come to school prior to present and get their mark and return to school straight after.

## School Meal Price Increase from January 2024

Unfortunately, Sefton have miscalculated their costs and are now claiming back over £6,000 which we have not budgeted for. As you can imagine we are as annoyed and as disappointed as you are about the increase in costs and will be doing all we can to fight this. However, it does mean we will have to increase the school meal costs again from 8<sup>th</sup> January 2024 to £2.50 per day. I am appalled by Sefton catering's incompetence but we are now left with over £6,000 which they are claiming back from us.

### **Swimming in January 2024**

Year 3 will swim every day from our first day, Monday 8<sup>th</sup> January until Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> January and then the same the following week Monday 15<sup>th</sup> to Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> January. Swimming kit information can be found here.

Year 4 will continue to swim each Wednesday from 10<sup>th</sup> January until Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> February 2024 inclusive.

## Yoga After School Club 4.15PM Session

Yoga starts the **first week back in the new year – 9<sup>th</sup> January 2024**. As the older children do not start their yoga class until 4.15pm and there are no other clubs available until week commencing 15<sup>th</sup> January, we will allow them to join in with the younger children at 3.15PM or stay and read in a classroom for an hour. After the first week the children must be in another club or go home and come back as all the staff will be busy taking their own after school clubs.
