You have 190 days to come to school and 175 to do everything else! Please see attached letter regarding the increase in penalty notices for unauthorised absences.

Regular attendance at school is significant to a child's educational development and progress. There is now a bigger <u>Government drive to improve attendance</u>. When a child's attendance falls to 90% or below it is classed as persistent absence. We hope that by working together, attendance will improve and children will achieve fully in school. The school's policy for attendance is available on the school <u>website</u>.

We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96% attendance. Year 4 had the highest attendance for last week -97.2%. Other class attendance was as follows: Y3 - 97%, Y6 - 95.9%, R - 94.8%, Y2 - 94.3%, Y5 - 92.7%, Y1 - 90%, N - 82.6%. The classes in green are above our target of 96% and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those
