Attendance

Congratulations to Nursery who had the highest attendance for the last week with 98.96%. Other class attendance was as follows:

After School Clubs after Easter

Details on After School Clubs being offered after Easter can be found here. Please send an email to childrensuniversity.stoswalds@schools.sefton.gov.uk to apply for a place. If children are opting to take a place the expectation is that they attend EVERY WEEK.

If children are not committed to attending the clubs we will no longer offer them places on the clubs. We are wasting schools' funds paying for places that aren't attended, school budgets are under more pressure than ever.

Please make dentist or doctors appointments for a night when your child doesn't have a club. If a child is not attending club they will lose their credits, which will affect their chances of graduating.

Staff run the clubs out of goodwill and commit to ten weeks of their time - so we expect the same in return. If you sign up for a club parents and children must show commitment and attend, just as we do.
