We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96% or better attendance.

Congratulations to Year 1 who had the highest attendance for the last week with 98.61%. Other class attendance was as follows:

Y6 - 97.33%, Y4 - 96.07%, Y2 - 94.48%, Y3 - 92.76%, N- 92.33% R- 90.97%, Y5 - 90.34%

The classes in green are above our target of 96% and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance.
